

## North Yorkshire Integrated Domestic Abuse Services

## Introduction

North Yorkshire County Council commissions a support service for people who are experiencing or at risk of Domestic Abuse across North Yorkshire.

## **Overview of Service**

The main aim of the service is to provide a consistent and high quality outcome focussed integrated domestic abuse service to high and medium risk victims/survivors and members of their household, including children and young people either in refuge accommodation or through a "Making Safe" floating support service within the victims/survivors own or other accommodation. The service enables victims/survivors and their families to make informed choices about their safety, health, housing and any other identified outcome needs. There are 2 elements to the service:

- Refuge provision for Women and Children To provide a refuge service that is safe and secure, providing a holistic approach toward the assessment of need and risk and a clear support pathway for women (aged 16+ years) and women with children.
- "Making Safe" floating support service for victims/survivors To provide a
   "Making Safe" service for victims/survivors, including children and young
   people through community support and the delivery of specialised
   accommodation related support in a floating support setting enabling them to
   remain safe in their own home or to continue to live independently in other
   accommodation.

The service, **North Yorkshire Integrated Domestic Abuse Service**, is provided by **Independent Domestic Abuse Services (IDAS)** across North Yorkshire.
