

The English housing stock

Monitored through the English Housing Survey

22 million homes

52 million people


- Half of homes are over 50 years old

- One in five is over 100 years old

- 100,000+ new homes provided each year

- Only 20,000 demolished

99.9% remain from one year to the next




Legend

YNYER Housing Strategy 2015-21

- 1. Work with Partners to increase the supply of good quality new housing all tenures & locations
- 2. Ensure our housing stock meets the needs of urban, rural and coastal communities
- Ensure that housing stock meets the diverse needs of communities at all stages of their lives

- 4. Ensure new homes are of a high design & environmental quality
- 5. Continue to make best use of <u>existing</u> stock & ensure it is of a decent quality to meet community needs
- 6. Ensure all homes have a <u>positive impact</u> on health & well being and are affordable to run

- 7. <u>Continue to reduce</u> <u>homelessness</u>
- 8. Ensure housing is allocated fairly and on the <u>basis of need</u>
- Provide appropriate housing and support for those with specific needs

Key Aims

- Double rate of housebuilding (from 2012 - 2014 levels), to around 5,400 p.a.
- Triple rate of Affordable Housing delivery to around 2,700 p.a.
- Get Local Plans in place
- Increase diversity of size, type and tenure, including for older people
- Increase energy efficiency and reduce impact of housing on health & wellbeing
- Continue to prevent homelessness though partnership working
