



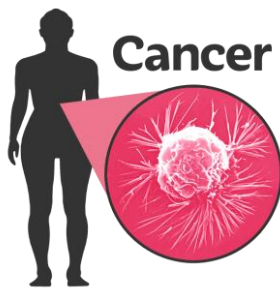


North Yorkshire Learning Disability Health Task Group – Full Minutes

	<p>These are the minutes from the North Yorkshire Health Task Group</p>
	<p>We met at the Folk Hall, New Earswick on 19th November, 2019.</p>
	<p>Welcome and introductions</p> <p>We all introduced ourselves. Shanna and Julie told us the meeting rules and housekeeping information.</p>
	<p>Minutes and actions from last meeting</p> <p>We agreed the minutes of the last meeting were accurate. We updated the action points.</p> <p><u>Action point 5</u> – ‘Sign up to the Health Charter for Social Care Providers’.</p> <p>This action has now been removed. Shanna will make sure information about the Health Charter is put in the Providers Newsletter.</p> <p><u>New Action</u> – ‘Need to produce a hospital passport letter which also covers York’.</p> <p>It was confirmed that any hospital passport can be used at all hospitals.</p>

What we talked about



Cancer Alliance Emma Lewin told us about the Cancer Champion Programme which is part of the Humber, Coast and Vale Health and Care Partnership. They provide training for Cancer Champions.

Cancer Champions are everyday people who want to fight cancer. They do this by getting involved in their communities, talking openly about cancer and sharing important messages.

Since the start of the programme there has been an increase in the number of people attending screening.

Emma answered the questions we had. These are on a separate document, attached.



Transforming Care - Michelle Haggart, Transforming Care Team

Michelle said the aims of Transforming Care are about making sure:

- less people are in assessment units or hospital.
- people do not stay in hospital longer than they need.
- people get good quality care and support in hospital and in the community.

This project will become part of our 'everyday work' from April 2020. The team is working with GPs about the use of Health Care Plans.



Care and Treatment Reviews - Hakan Durmazm, NHS Care Treatment Lead

Hakan told us about Care and Treatment Reviews. They help people get the right care and support in an assessment unit in hospital or at home.

They are for people with a learning disability or autism or both or people with mental health needs.

Hakan answered the questions we had. These are on a separate piece of paper, attached

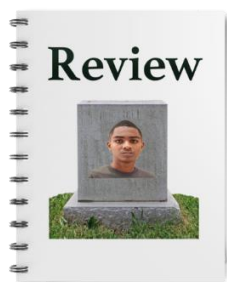


Co-chair elections

We voted that Christopher will be the new Co-chair of the Health Task Group and Mark will be the new Vice Co-chair. We still have to decide on the Independent Co-chair.



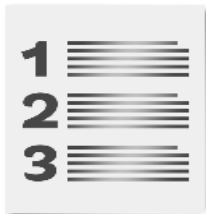
LeDeR programme update – Allison Brown

	<p>Feedback from Local Area Groups</p> <p>Julie gave a presentation for Hambleton and Richmondshire. The Friarage Hospital Urgent Treatment Centre opening hours may change.</p> <p>Mark gave a presentation for Scarborough, Whitby and Ryedale. He told us about good and bad experiences of health care.</p> <p>Christopher gave a presentation for Craven and Harrogate. He said that Health champions at Airedale Hospital are trialling an interactive video with Slimming World.</p>

Jane gave a presentation for Selby. She told us about good and bad experiences with Health and Social Care professionals.



Live Well, Live Longer update – Hannah Brown, NYCC Commissioning

Hannah gave a presentation about the health action plan in the Live Well Live Longer strategy.

She told us about the Health Charter for social care. It will be included in the new contracts for Supported Living.

Christopher told us that there is going to be a GP event in Bradford in February 2020. It will talk about Annual Health Checks and Social Prescribing. Chris will be attending with Karen Murray, Katie Peacock and Hannah. They hope to learn from the event and feed back.

Action Christopher to feed back on GP Event in Bradford at the next Health Task Group.

Action NYHTG would like Local Self Advocacy groups to do a workshop on health checks and social prescribing.



Anything else to tell the group

People with autism - Natasha said that people with autism are always missed out because Learning Disability Liaison Nurses cannot work with people with just autism.

The government has agreed to the proposal to train all health and social care staff about autism and learning disability.

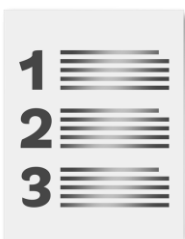
