healthwatch	Healthwatch North Yorkshire - Claire Canavan, Community Outreach Coordinator
North Yorkshire	Claire told us about her job for Healthwatch North Yorkshire. She talked about Enter and View which is when they visit services and see what can be better. They would like self-advocates to help. She will make some easy read information about this.
	Transitions for young disabled people – Cara Nimmo, NYCC Head of Care & Support Craven. Cara talked about new plans to make transitions better. This is when young disabled people move from children's social care to adults' social care.
	They will work with young people from 16 years of age so that people can get used to changes slowly over 2 years. This will start in June 2019 and go slowly until 2021 to make sure everyone is happy.
	There will be a Transitions board made up of managers, service users and children.

	Inclusion North Members Day - Celestino
inclusion	Cel talked about the Inclusion North meeting in York in January. They did lots of group work about what life looks like if we are getting it right.
	They also heard from self advocates who used personal budgets to learn how to dance and watched them dance.

	North Yorkshire Safe Places: Lesley Dale, NYCC
Safe place Pro	Lesley told us about work to make the Safe Places project work better. She said 186 businesses are now Safe Places but there are some issues.
	NYCC staff visited Safe Places in Scarborough and Skipton. They found some do not exist and some staff are not sure what Safe Places is.
	Lesley and her team are looking at how to increase the number of Safe Places and to increase awareness and understanding of Safe Places.
	Before Phase 2 can start we all agreed that phase 1 needed to be right first. They are working to get it right for the beginning of next year.
	Lesley asked if self-advocates wanted to help.
•	CQC accessible information working group
Care Quality Commission	Christopher told us about the work that he has been doing with CQC and other self-advocates to make CQC reports easier to read and understand. Christopher said that they are slowly making improvements. He told us that PhotoSymbols might want self-advocates to model for their photos!
