Self-advocates, family carers and independent co-chairs of Local Area Groups voted.

Candidates were not allowed to vote.

Shanna told us that Mark will be the new Self Advocate Co Chair. Christopher is the new Vice Co Chair. Katie Peacock will be the new Independent Co Chair. Jim agreed to be the Vice Co Chair. They will all start in 2020.

Everybody thanked Jim and Sam for their fantastic work as the current co-chairs.



5. Self-advocates Big Issues

Co-chairs of the Local Area Groups told us about the Big Issues they have been discussing.

Rebecca said **Scarborough**, **Whitby**, **Ryedale** are setting up a Talking Transport group about making transport more accessible in their area.

Jane from **Selby** told us about a visit they had from Citizens Advice Bureau. They give advice and signpost people on finance, legal and welfare matters. They are a free service.

Natasha from **Craven and Harrogate** said we need to have some clearer information about meetings which link to the Partnership Board which we can share with new people.

Hambleton and Richmondshire talked about making it easier to find out about local activities happening in the community.



Live Well Live Longer Delivery Group

We heard about work by self-advocates with Hannah Brown from North Yorkshire County Council on the Big Action Plan.

Hannah asked self advocates to help with some of the actions. We said Hannah should come to local groups to start working together.

They have finished the Annual Health Check plan and are looking at the draft plan for training health and social care professionals.

Jamie chatted with self advocates about their work with the Safeguarding Adults Board.

Sam Suttar talked about going to a workshop at Nottingham University with Christoper, Katie and Jamie to talk about abuse.

Sam Sellars told us self-advocates worked with Inclusion North on new Easy Read books about Keeping Safe. They should be available soon.



Safe Places

Mark told us about a meeting with Lesley Dale about plans to make sure people know about Safe Places.

Self-advocates will write a letter to explain how important the scheme is. They will also do a check list which will be sent to all Safe Places. Mark will do a blog for the KeyRing website.



Mark and Jess did some acting to show a person going into a Safe Places venue where the shop assistant did not know anything about the scheme.



North Yorkshire Health Task Group

Julie told us about the meeting in August. They met with Ben and Jo who are learning disability nurses. They discussed how to make local Health Task Groups work better in each area. They talked about the LeDeR programme.

The Health Task Group will elect new co chairs in October 2019.



Meetings in 2020

We now have three meetings a year. We asked if people thought this was working. People said it was a good idea and liked going to different areas for meetings.
