
#### What is 'transition'?



It is about supporting a young person and their family when they move from Children's social care services to Adult social care services.

We are making sure that transition follows the Big Ideas of Preparing for Adulthood.

### Preparing for Adulthood – the Big Ideas





Children's social care and Adults social care teams are working together to make **transition** work better for young people



We are making a new transition **pathway** for young people

A pathway is a name for the journey we go on together to prepare young people for adulthood

We will start using the new pathway from June 2019

### Aims of the new pathway



Person Centred

- The new pathway will make the experience for young people and their families better
- It will make the move from Children's services to Adult services easier, more supportive and gradual.
- Young people will have the right support, from the right person at the right time.
- It will have a person centred approach

#### What will be different?

Between 16-18, Children and Adult services work together to support young person Adult assessments and support plans will completed from 17

Children services to end their involvement after 18 SEN remain involved until the Education Health and Care Plan is ended.

## When will the changes happen?

We will start using the new pathway from June 2019

We will make the changes slowly, until April 2021

We will keep talking to young people and staff to make sure the new pathway is working how we all want it to.







 We will have a Transitions Board to make sure the new pathway is working well

 Managers from Children's and Adult social care will be on the Transitions Board

The Board will check with young people and families to make sure the new pathway is working

The Directors of Children's and Adults social care will check to make sure it is working.
