Christopher Porter has been hard at work recently for Learning Disability England (LDE). He was chosen as one of five self-advocates, getting paid work as a quality checker for the LDE website.

Christopher has also been working with the KeyRing national office on a lived experience group for online hate crime. The group has been working with other charities to find out why hate crime happens online including social media such as Twitter and Facebook.



They have sent out three surveys and have been looking at the information they got back. They will write a report about what can be done to reduce online hate crime.

The Partnership Board has still been busy with work across North Yorkshire.


